

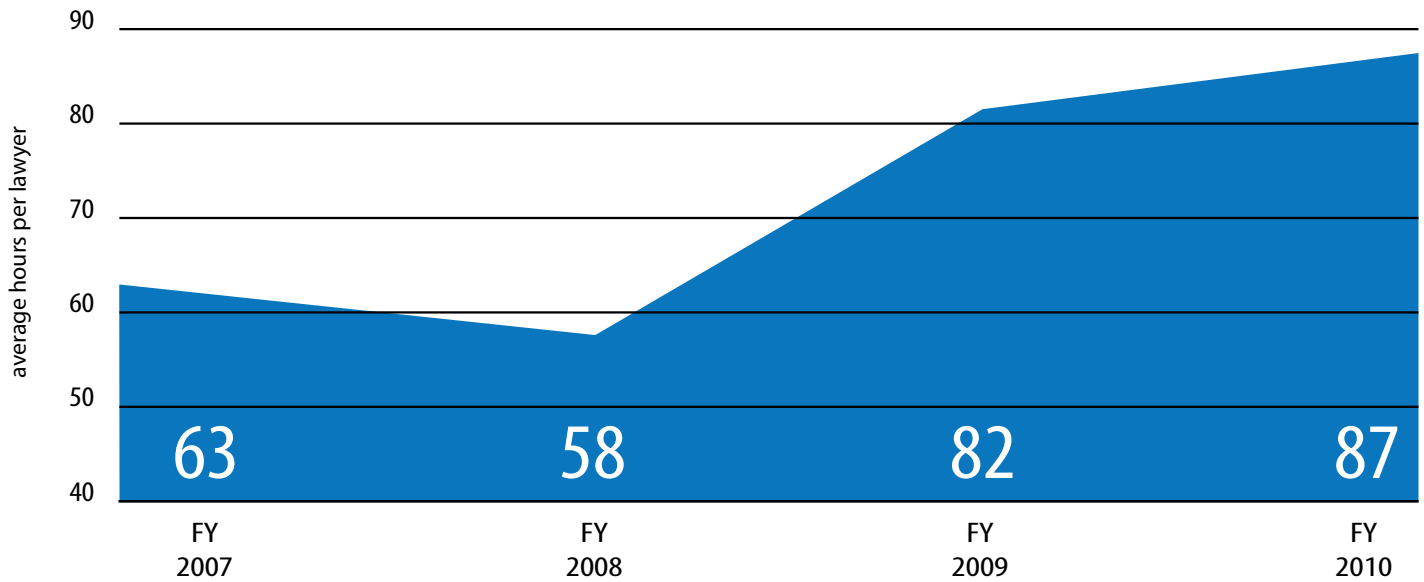

The program has recently been expanded, through a project called Lawyers Helping Warriors, to represent those serving in our current war on terror.

Number of organizations and individuals currently supporting efforts to repeal the fees due from Haitians who are applying for temporary protected status to stay in the United States after the devastating earthquake in Haiti. Hunton & Williams is spearheading an effort to bring groups together to work with the U.S. Director of Citizenship and Immigration Services to terminate the fees, in the hopes that a greater number of Haitians will be able to apply for status and then send a percentage of their earnings home to assist in rebuilding efforts.

Number of lawyers and staff trained to participate in the Hunton & Williams/ExxonMobil pro bono partnership established in 2009.
