Wally Martinez Named One of "The 50 Most Influential Minority Lawyers in America"

Martinez was a founding partner of the Hunton & Williams' Miami office, where his practice focused on complex business litigation and white-collar criminal defense. He left the firm for three years to serve as senior vice president and general counsel at Diageo North America. He returned to Hunton & Williams to become managing partner in 2006 at age 39, one of the youngest named to lead a global firm. Martinez has made diversity a firmwide priority, and helped increase minority lawyer retention to 80 percent last year.

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
